#### **Their Past Your Future**

BCHRC and SWSHAS have made a joint application to the Museums Libraries and Archives agency in London for grant funding. This will be used to enable BCHRC to work alongside SWSHAS's successful and popular Michaelmas Fair exhibition, which this year is entitled "Keep the Homes Fires Burning". We are hoping to buy digital voice recorders which can be used by the Bishop's Castle Army Cadets Force to record local people's memories of Shropshire in times of war. It will also involve training in the use of the

recorders and editing software, which will then be available for future community use.

Plans are well under way for the Grand Opening of the Bowling Club following their renovations. A display detailing the research carried out by BCHRC on behalf of the Club will be on show together with interpretation boards and leaflets produced by BCHRC to share this research with the Club and the public. A surprise visitor to one of our Talks in the Town Hall was Mr John Groome from Oswestry, who made himself known to us and told us about his collection of documents relating to his grandfather Thomas Henry George, proprietor of the Castle Hotel and Mayor of Bishop's Castle in the early twentieth century. We invited Mr Groome to our Partners' Evening on 15 May, and he very kindly left the documents with us for copying and adding to our research collection.

The documents include an article and other papers and photographs relating to Mr George's mayoralty, and also detailed inventories of sales at the Castle Hotel and Castle Hotel Farm (sic) following Mr George's death in 1917, as well as share certificates from the Bishop's Castle Electric Light & Power Co Ltd. Mr Groome also attended the Mayor Making in Bishop's Castle on 27 May.
