BISHOP'S CASTLE.

BISHOP'S CASTLE is an ancient Corporate and Market Town, head of a County Court district, and polling place for the Southern division of Salop, 20 miles from Shrewsbury and 20 from Ludlow. The Parish includes the Liberties and Townships of Colebatch, Woodbatch, Broughton, Lee and Oakley, in the Hundred of Clun and Purslow, and in the Union of Clun. The Railway Station is a terminus from which there is a line to Craven Arms Junction. The town is governed by fifteen aldermen and councillors. The charter of incorporation dates from 1572. Rateable value, £6015. Population, 1086.

CLUN.

—:—

CLUN is a small Market Town and a most extensive Parish in the South-west of the County, within the Hundreds of Parslow and Clun, and County Court district of Bishop's Castle. The Town is situated on the river Clun, 6 miles from Bishop's Castle, 28 from Shrewsbury, 7 from Knighton, 16 from Ludlow, and 8 from Craven Arms. Broome and Hopton Heath, each 6 miles distant, are the nearest Railway Stations. It has a fine Parish Church, a large National School, and two Dissenting Chapels—a Wesleyan and Primitive Methodist. There is also an Hospital for the support of sixteen old men, founded by the Right Hon. Henry Howard, Earl of Northampton. The Townships of Newcastle, Spod, Whitcot-Evan and Whitcot-Keyset are formed into the ecclesiastical Parish of Newcastle, and there is a Chapel-of-Ease at Chapel Lawn. Offa's Dyke stretches along the West of the Parish, and Cser Caradoc is a stand of Caractacus. In the town are remains of an old castle. The area of the civil Parish is 19,684 acres; the rateable value, £18,348, and the population, 1748.
